

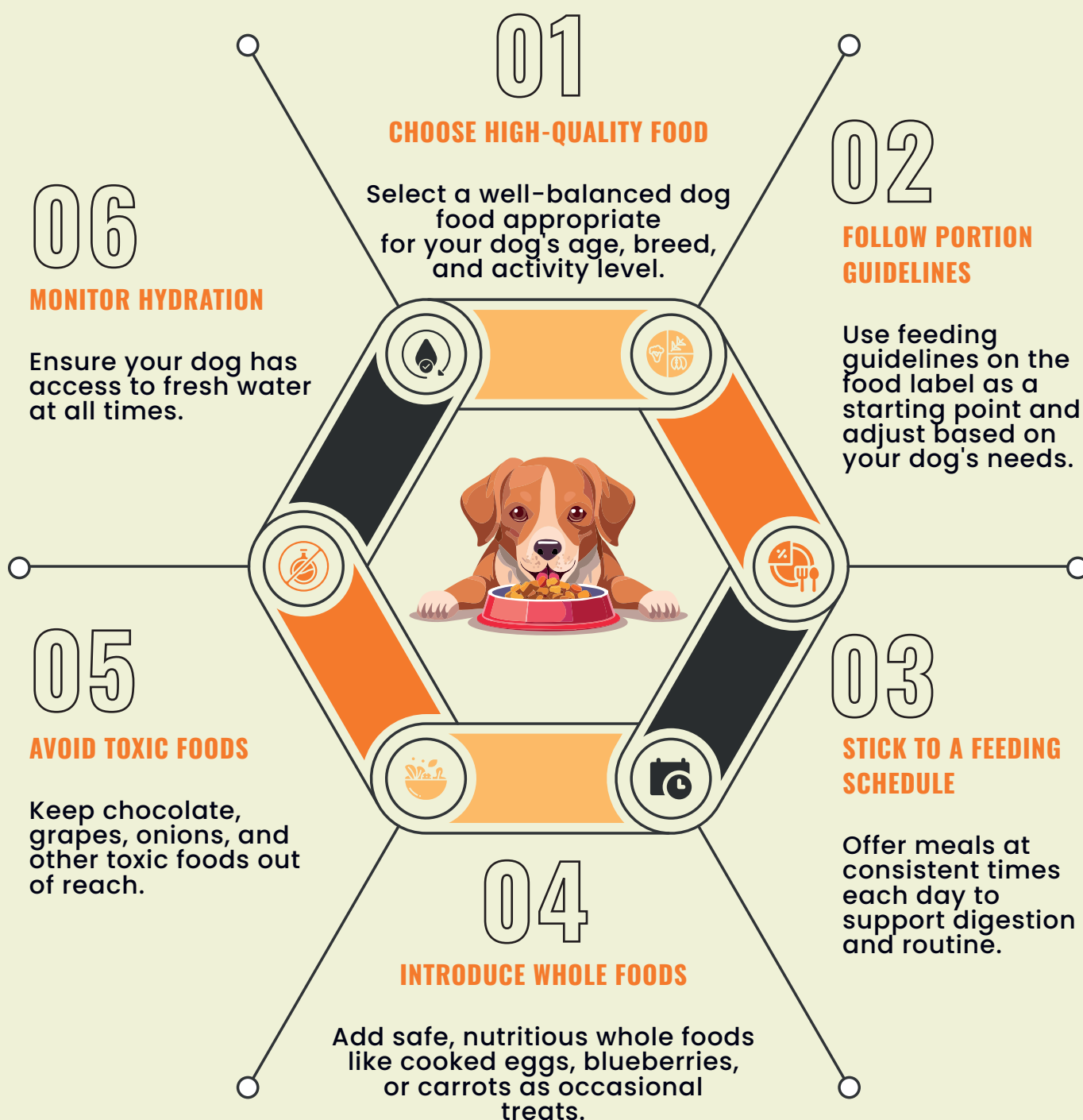

GIVE THEM SPACE

Allow your dog to decompress by creating a quiet, comfortable area where they can feel



STICK TO A ROUTINE

Introduce a consistent schedule for meals, potty breaks, and quiet time to reduce stress.



GO SLOW WITH INTRODUCTIONS

Limit interactions with people and pets until your dog feels more settled and confident.



OBSERVE THEIR BEHAVIOR

Take note of their body language, triggers, and preferences to better understand their needs.



BUILD TRUST THROUGH PATIENCE

Use gentle interactions, rewards, and positive reinforcement to create a bond.

6 TIPS FOR LEASH TRAINING YOUR DOG

USE THE RIGHT EQUIPMENT

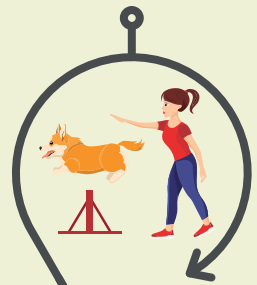
Choose a comfortable leash and collar or harness suited to your dog's size and breed.

REWARD GOOD BEHAVIOR

Use treats and praise to reinforce calm walking and staying by your side.

PRACTICE SHORT SESSIONS

Start with brief walks and gradually increase the duration as your dog improves.



START INDOORS

Practice leash walking in a distraction-free environment like your home or backyard.

TEACH "HEEL" OR "LET'S GO"

Introduce a command to signal your dog to walk beside you.

SET THE PACE

Walk at a steady pace, and stop immediately if your dog pulls.



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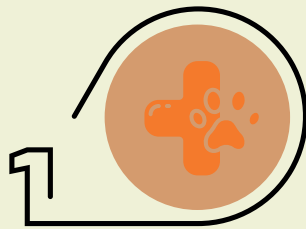

10 THINGS TO DO WITH YOUR NEW PUPPY

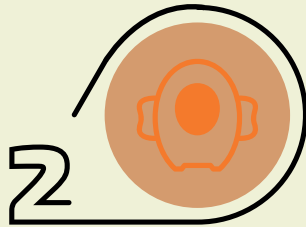
SCHEDULE A VET VISIT

Ensure your puppy gets a health check, vaccinations, and preventive care.



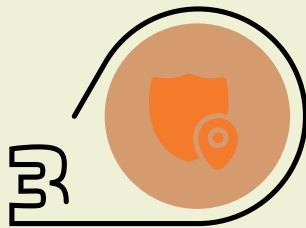
START POTTY TRAINING IMMEDIATELY

Establish a consistent routine and reward success to build good habits.



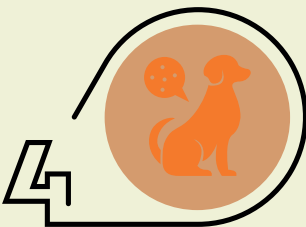
INTRODUCE A SAFE SPACE

Set up a crate or designated area where your puppy can feel secure.



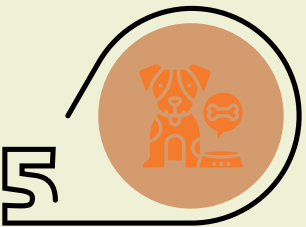
BEGIN SOCIALIZATION

Safely expose your puppy to different people, places, and experiences.



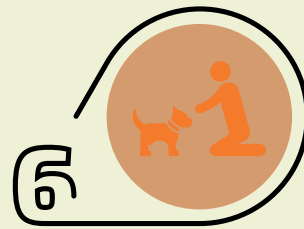
SET UP A FEEDING SCHEDULE

Choose high-quality puppy food and stick to regular meal times.



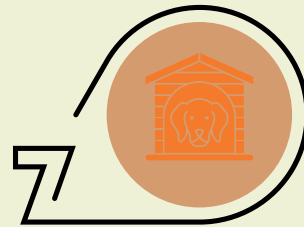
TEACH BASIC COMMANDS

Start with simple commands like "sit," "stay," and "come" to build communication.



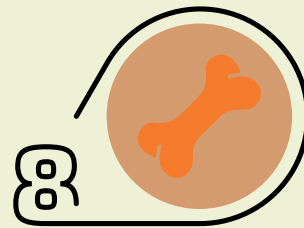
PUPPY-PROOF YOUR HOME

Remove hazards like cords, chemicals, and small objects from your puppy's reach.



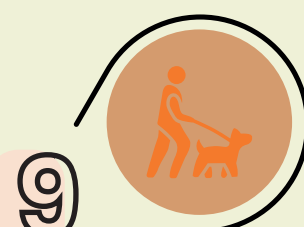
PROVIDE APPROPRIATE CHEW TOYS

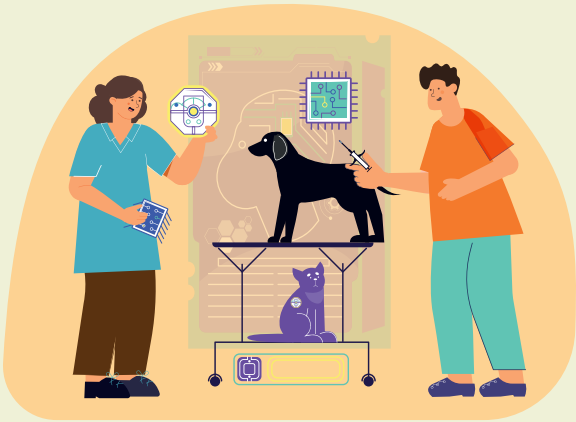

DOG EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS



Develop Your Individual Disaster Plan

Dog owners must take responsibility for their pets during disasters. Make sure your plan includes the following 10 points:



01 IDENTIFICATION

Ensure permanent identification for your dog, such as a microchip or collar tags with updated contact information. Include:

- Microchip registered with current contact details.
 - Collar with an ID tag displaying the dog's name and your phone number.
- In emergencies, consider a temporary method like writing your number on the collar with a marker. Take full-frame and close-up photos of your dog from multiple angles, noting unique features. Store copies in a safe place or digitally.

02 COLLARS, LEASHES, AND HARNESSES

Have multiple leashes, collars, or harnesses ready for use. Attach a luggage tag with details like:

- Dog's name
- Your name, address, phone number, and email
- Emergency contact details

04 TRANSPORTATION

If you own a car or crate, ensure it's ready for safe transport. Practice loading and unloading your dog calmly to reduce stress during emergencies.



06 EVACUATION PLANS

Plan evacuation routes and shelters that accept dogs. Identify pet-friendly hotels, friends, or boarding facilities. Research local resources and keep this list accessible.

08 COMMUNICATE YOUR PLAN

Share evacuation details with family or neighbors. Keep instructions posted at home for responders, including:

- Your dog's name, behavior notes, and medical needs.
- Contact details for you and your vet.



03 MEDICAL RECORDS AND PHOTOS

Prepare a waterproof kit with your dog's:

- Vaccination records (e.g., Rabies, Distemper).
- Veterinary information and medications.
- A photo of your dog for identification if separated.

05 DOES YOUR DOG LOAD WELL?

Practice crate training and car travel to ensure your dog is comfortable and cooperative during transportation. This is essential during evacuations.

07 BACK-UP PLAN

In case evacuation isn't possible, plan for safe containment. Examples:

- Keeping your dog secured at home with supplies.
- Leaving them with trusted neighbors.

09 EVACUATE EARLY

If there's a risk, evacuate with your dog as soon as possible. Avoid last-minute stress by packing essential supplies and planning routes ahead of time.

10 SUPPLIES

Prepare a Go Bag for your dog with:

- Food and water for 72 hours.
- Bowls, waste bags, and cleaning supplies.
- First-aid kit (bandages, tweezers, antiseptic, etc.).
- Comfort items (blanket, toys, familiar scents).
- Medications and an extra leash or harness.
